



The reward: a very successful tournament with lots of tight matches and an extremely positive atmosphere on all three days. Even the high summer temperatures – the reason that some courts were behind the time schedule – caused no great problems.

The good spirits lasted through to the evenings, where many squash masters were celebrating and dancing through to the early hours.

On Sunday there were many close and exciting finals, mostly refereed by official referees, where squash at its best was to be seen. The closest decision was in Men's Over 60, where in the final group the number

of



185 players from 22 countries met in Krefeld, Germany for the 19th International German Masters Championships. Des mond Sacco and John van Hees wijk even came from South Africa to take part in this international tournament and to recruit entries for the World Championship in Johannesburg this summer.

The German Masters was for the third time in a row by far the largest tournament in the ESF Masters Circuit and required a lot of work from the organising team.

games won decided that Alan Hathway (ENG) was to be the German Open Champion, closely followed by Paul Harris (SCO) and Derek Lawrence (RSA).

# **Masters Tournament Evaluation**

# and Checklist, by Jean-Marc Fraipont

Since the beginning of 2015, a vital mission was established in the Masters Sub-Committee (MSC):

To evaluate and improve Masters **Tournaments** 

During discussions amongst members of the MSC, it was decided that we provide guidance for Tournament Directors (TDs) in organising their tournaments for the benefit of everyone involved.

#### The Checklist Was Born

It is for this reason that the "Checklist" was created. It was tested and improved during the last few tournaments of 2015 and now we use it for each tournament.

Everyone in the world of squash will experience the benefits: 1) The MSC has a tool to

ments. This

is to determine the tournament levels (Master Open, Grand Prix and Super Series) for next season. Based on this evaluation, the Director of MSC will send feedback to the TD. This will enable him to correct mistakes or shortcomings but above all to improve the quality of their next tournament, and to also highlight

the positive efforts made for the benefit of everyone who participates - family, friends, supporters and players.

2) The TD, in preparation of his tournament, has a document containing all mandatory or recommended options as part of this evaluation. In addition he can ask for advice from members of the MSC as often as necessary. There is a regular dialogue between the MSC and the TD.

After the tournament he will receive a summary of positive and

> negative points of his tournament so that further improvements can be implemented for future tournaments.

3) The Players - In playing, players have certain expectations. After all, in partici-

pating, tournaments cost money, therefore, it is only natural that players expect a certain level of organization of the highest possible quality.

Expectations can vary:

In summary, players are motivated for different reasons. Our duty, the Masters Sub-Committee's duty, is to manage and to reconcile all of these reasons and to meet as many of your expectations as possible.
